Fig. 1 Applications for Graduate and Postgraduate Courses 1992–2002

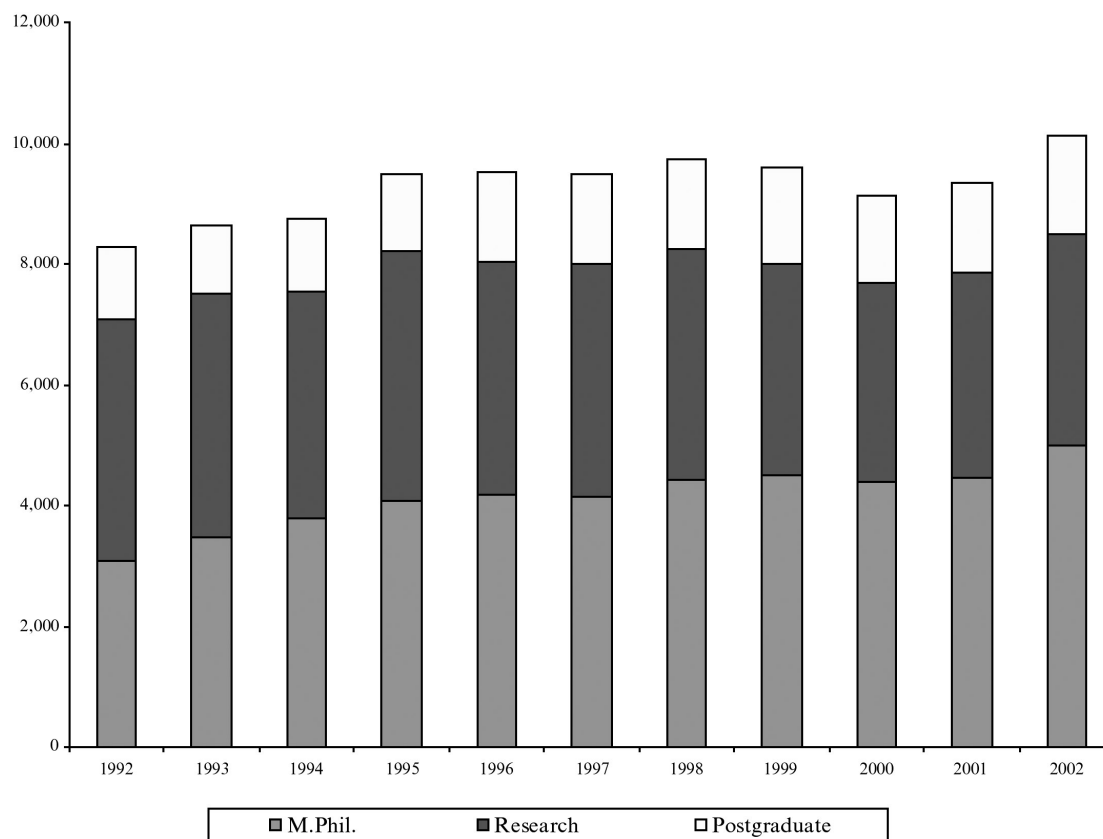


Fig. 2 Applications by fee status for Graduate and Postgraduate Courses 1992–2002

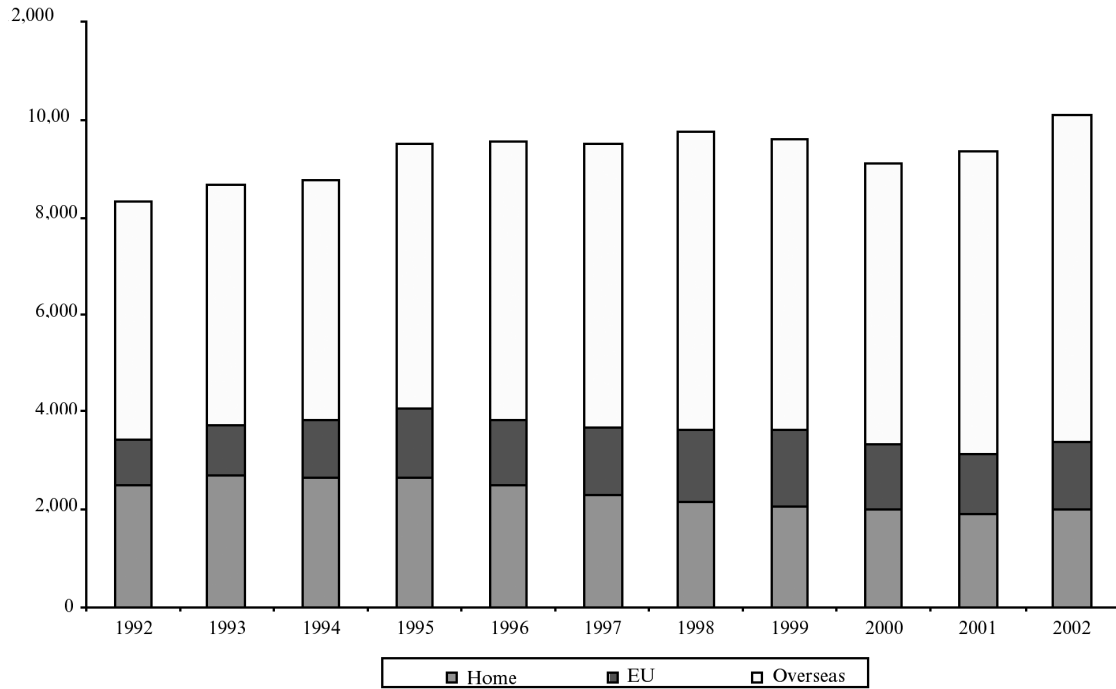


Fig. 3 Graduate Students coming into residence by fee status 1992–2002

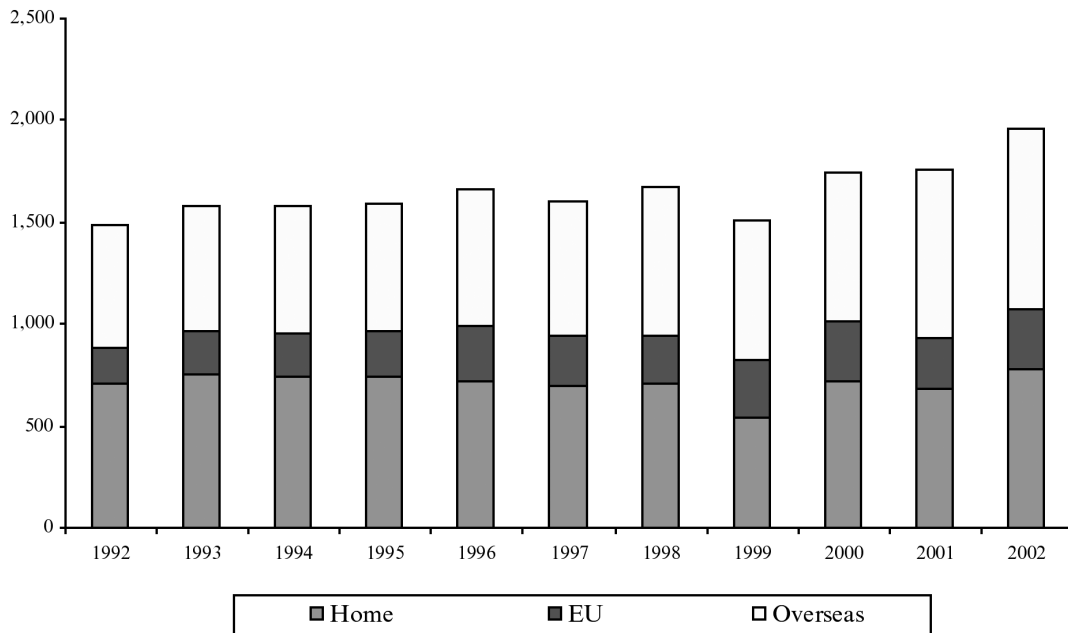

Fig. 4 Number of Graduate Students in residence by fee status 1992–2002

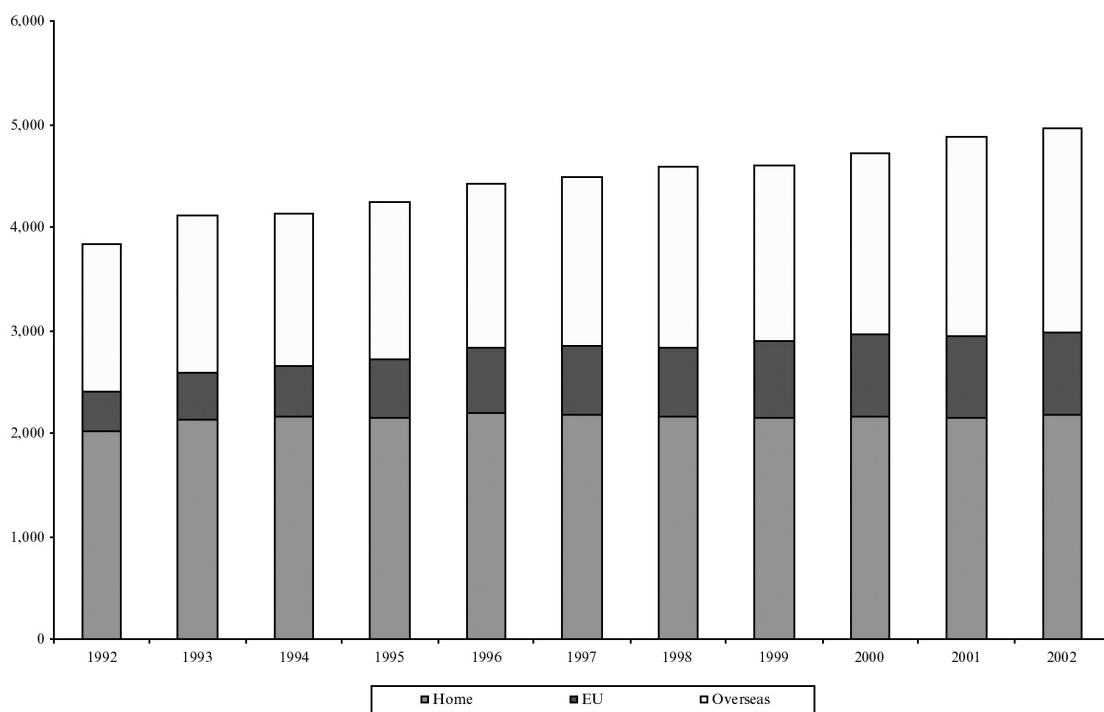
