Table 3 Number and percentage of applications and acceptances by GCE A level grade scores and gender

• Of those accepted 91% (91%) achieved three grades As (or more) counting only their best three A levels excluding General Studies.

Table 7 Number and percentage of Home applications and acceptances by ethnic origin and percentage success rate

• The proportion of those accepted who declare they have an ethnic minority background or other is 13% (13%). In addition 6% (5%) of those accepted chose not to declare their ethnic origin.

Table 8 Number and percentage of applications and acceptances by disability and percentage success rate

• The proportion of those accepted who declare they have disability is 3% (3%).

Notes for information

- The tables and charts show the total number of applications and acceptances for October 2003. They exclude 381 (355) applicants through UCAS who did not submit a Cambridge Application Form (CAF) in addition to the UCAS form.
- Acceptance figures include only those applicants who received an unconditional firm (UF) offer of a place. It excludes those made conditional offers who were unsuccessful at confirmation or who subsequently declined their place after becoming UF. Table 5 gives the total number of conditional offers made.
- In many places percentages have been rounded to the nearest whole number, so totals do not always add up to 100.
