In Table 3.1 the three highest A level grades in all subjects, excluding General Studies, are used for scoring purposes. The UCAS tariff score refers to the scoring system where at A level A = 120, B = 100, C = 80, D = 60, E = 40 and where at AS level A = 60, B = 50, C = 40, D = 30, E = 20. More information about the UCAS tariff is available on the UCAS website at www.ucas.ac.uk. The old score refers to the scoring system where A = 10, B = 8, C = 6, D = 4, and E = 2.
