All users require a University Card for registration and subsequent admission to the Language Centre.

IN THE LANGUAGE CENTRE YOU CAN:

- **Take a CULP (Cambridge University Language Programme) course** in the Michaelmas and Lent terms or the Long Vacation term in **Mandarin Chinese, French, German, Italian, Russian and Spanish**. A contributory fee is charged for the courses which are open to all students and staff of the university and receive Language Centre accreditation.
- **Join the A. J. Pressland Academic Reading Course in German** in the Long Vacation term.
- **Apply for an A. J. Pressland Fund Bursary** which are available to students for language study abroad during the Long Vacation Term. (Priority for A.J. Pressland course attendance and bursary applications will be given to students from the Schools of Physical and Biological Sciences, Technology and Clinical Medicine).
- **Obtain English language support** through the **English for Academic Purposes Programme (EAP)** for a fee. Priority is given to post-graduate students from abroad.
- **Study any of 150+ languages** from basic to advanced level on a self-access basis in the John Trim Centre, with advice and support available. New acquisitions and resources are listed monthly on the Resource Library web pages.
- **Discuss** your learning needs and plan your individual programme with a member of the **advising team**.
- **Enter into a conversation exchange** with a speaker of the language you are learning.
- **Access** language learning programmes, digital television recordings, other online resources, links to external language resources, newspapers and courses abroad.
- **Watch live satellite television in 12 languages**. Selected recordings are made every night and news bulletins are digitised for online use.
- **View foreign films and documentaries in over 70 languages**, many with sub-titles.
- **Listen to authentic audio recordings**, ranging from contemporary lecture series to historical speeches, etc.
- **Consult reference materials** and directories on living and working abroad and investigate feedback from students who have attended language courses in other countries.
- **Prepare for attending conferences** or undertaking field-work in other countries.
- **Consult resources** on language learning and teaching methodology.

THE TEACHING ROOMS

Four teaching rooms are available, each offering a flexible teaching and learning environment for up to 20 students. One room can be divided into two smaller rooms which will each accommodate 10 students. The rooms are equipped with:

- an OHP
- a plasma screen for group viewing facilities
- a multimedia PC connected to the Language Centre TV and data network
- access to live or recorded digital satellite programmes

A portable audio-active comparative laboratory is also available on request. Technical support and advice is available on the use of the equipment.
